PREREQUISITES FOR ADMISSION TO THE NURSING PROGRAM

Completion of the following with a "C" or better:

- ▶ BIO 230 - Anatomy *
 - ▶ BIO 231 - Physiology *
 - ▶ BIO 259 - Microbiology *
 - ▶ HLH 214 or HLH 215 - Nutrition
 - ▶ SOC 200, SOC 201, ETH 202, or ANT 201 - Sociology
 - ▶ ENG 200 - English
 - ▶ COM 203 or COM 210 - Speech
 - ▶ PSY 205, PSY 210, PSY 215, or CDV 200 - Psychology
- * Sciences must meet recency requirement. Grades of A or B are valid for 10 years, grade C is valid for 5 years**
- Completion of RN Program Prerequisites, General Education, and Institutional Requirements before applying
- Interested individuals should see an Academic Counselor for advisement on prerequisites and General Education course sequencing
- ▶ High School Diploma or Equivalent (GED)
 - ▶ Clear Background Check and Drug Screening
 - ▶ US Citizenship or Permanent Residency with Valid Social Security Number or Individual Tax Identification Number
 - ▶ Recommended: One year recent LVN Med-Surg experience

OTHER INFORMATION/ REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Post-acceptance physical exam, lab tests & immunizations are required.
- ✓ Science prerequisite courses must be at least 4 semester units each, with a lab.
- Transportation to clinical sites is the responsibility of the student.
- ✓ Clinical hours may include day, evenings, or weekend hours.
- Program consists of lecture/lab days and one clinical day per week.
- ✓ Transition semester is one day per week on campus.
- Applicants who meet the minimum grade requirements are eligible for the lottery for admission. Grade requirements are based on overall college GPA, English GPA, as well as Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology GPA.
- ✓ Non-degree 30-unit option, admission is on a space available basis only.
- ✓ Successful TEAS Exam passing score of at least 62% is required.
- ✓ 4 students are accepted each Spring.
- ✓ On-site pre-application workshop is required.

LVN-TO-RN PROGRAM

The Mendocino College LVN-to-RN Program is designed for LVNs currently licensed in California to obtain the education and training needed to sit for the California Registered Nursing Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN).

The program is two full-time semesters of RN courses as well as one short-term transition course after completion of prerequisites and general education.

Applications are available each September for Spring admission.

PLEASE NOTE

If you are an LVN that challenged the LVN boards from military service, you are eligible for admission with **Advanced Standing** to our second semester. The program is three semesters of full-time coursework. Visit our website for an Advanced Standing application.
