



5 Steps to Apply for Financial Aid



Step 1: Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application CADAA.

Students must file a FAFSA every year to determine their eligibility for financial aid. The application is available on December 31. It is recommended that students file the FAFSA or CADAA prior to the April 2 priority date in order to be considered for Cal Grants, or September 2 for continuing community college students. *Mendocino College's school code is 011672.*

- 2023-2024 FAFSA/CADAA cover Fall 2023, Spring 2024, and Summer 2024
- 2024-2025 FAFSA/CADAA cover Fall 2024, Spring 2025, and Summer 2025

FAFSA: If you are a U.S. citizen, permanent resident or eligible non-citizen, complete the FAFSA to be reviewed for federal and state aid at <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>

CADAA: If you are an undocumented student and meet the qualifications of AB 540 (Assembly Bill 540) complete the California Dream Act Application to be reviewed for state aid at <http://dream.csac.ca.gov>

Step 2: Complete Required Documents

Once the FAFSA or CADAA has been submitted, Mendocino College will receive the student's information for processing. If additional information is needed to process the file, the Financial Aid Office will email the student and the required documents will be listed in MyMendo.

- Go to <https://my.mendocino.edu>
- Select "My Financial Aid Status" from Student Self Service
- Select the appropriate Award Year
- Review your Checklist and select "Complete required documents" if action needed
- Click on the underlined document to be taken to the form you need to complete
- You must submit all documents to complete your Financial Aid File and determine your eligibility.

Step 3: Review Your Financial Aid Offer

After a student's financial aid file is processed and completed, the awarding of eligible financial aid begins. Financial aid awards are based on the student's eligibility for each particular aid program. In your Checklist select "Review your Financial Aid Award Package". That will list the awards you are eligible for. You can also select "Review your Financial Aid Offer Letter" if you need to have the Offer Letter printed.

Step 4: Receive Financial Aid

Mendocino College has partnered with BankMobile to deliver your financial aid disbursement. This partnership will give students options for receiving financial aid funds. For more information visit www.refundselection.com

Step 5: Maintain Eligibility

Satisfactory Academic Progress - You must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards to receive awards. Your Satisfactory Academic Progress will be listed in the banner of your MyMendo account. For more information visit www.mendocino.edu/student-services/financial-aid/satisfactory-academic-progress

Pell Grant Lifetime Eligibility - The amount of Federal Pell Grant funds you may receive over your lifetime is limited by federal law to be the equivalent of 600%. You can view your Pell Lifetime Eligibility Used on your MyMendo account.

PREREQUISITES, COREQUISITES AND RECOMMENDED PREPARATIONS

It is the intent of Mendocino College to guide students into courses in which they will have the greatest chance for academic success. Therefore, students will find that some have prerequisites, co-requisites or recommended preparation in their description. Following are the definitions for prerequisites, co-requisites, and recommended preparation:

Prerequisite - A course requirement that a student must meet in order to demonstrate current readiness for enrollment in a course or educational program. Completion of the prerequisite is required prior to enrolling in the course. Successful completion of a prerequisite course means that a grade of A, B, C, or P, was earned; C-, D, F, or NP grades are not acceptable.

Co-requisite - A course that a student is required to simultaneously take in order to enroll in another course. (If a course is listed as both a prerequisite and a corequisite it can be taken before or concurrently.)

Advisories on recommended preparation - indicates knowledge or skills that will be of great advantage to a student prior to enrollment in a specific course but are not required. (Recommended Preparations can be found in the Mendocino College Catalog online)

Prerequisite Challenge Procedure

If students feel they can meet the requirements, or one of the conditions listed below exists, and can provide documentation, then they can challenge a prerequisite. A Prerequisite Challenge Form can be obtained from the Mendocino College website or Admissions and Records Offices at the Ukiah campus, Lake and North County Centers. The challenge must be filed in the Office of Admissions and Records no later than the first day of the semester. Criteria for challenging a course are:

1. The prerequisite or co-requisite has not been established in accordance with the District's process for establishing prerequisites and co-requisites.
2. The prerequisite or co-requisite is in violation of Title 5, section 55003 Policies for Prerequisites, Co-requisites, and Advisories on Recommended Preparation.
3. The prerequisite or co-requisite is either unlawfully discriminatory or is being applied in an unlawfully discriminatory manner.
4. The student has the knowledge or ability to succeed in the course or program despite not meeting the prerequisite or co-requisite.
5. The student will be subject to undue delay in attaining the goal of his/her educational plan because the prerequisite or co-requisite course has not been made reasonably available.

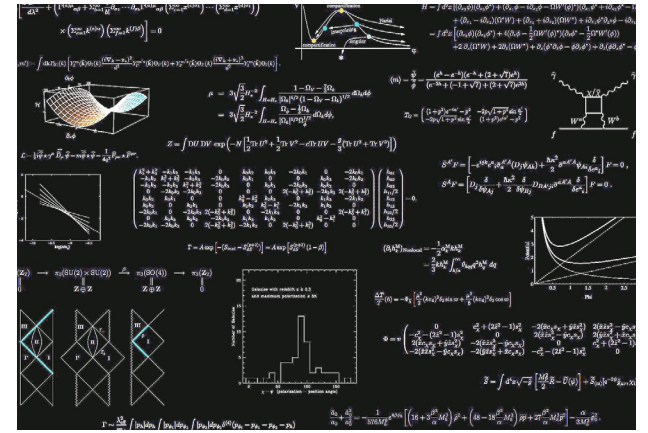

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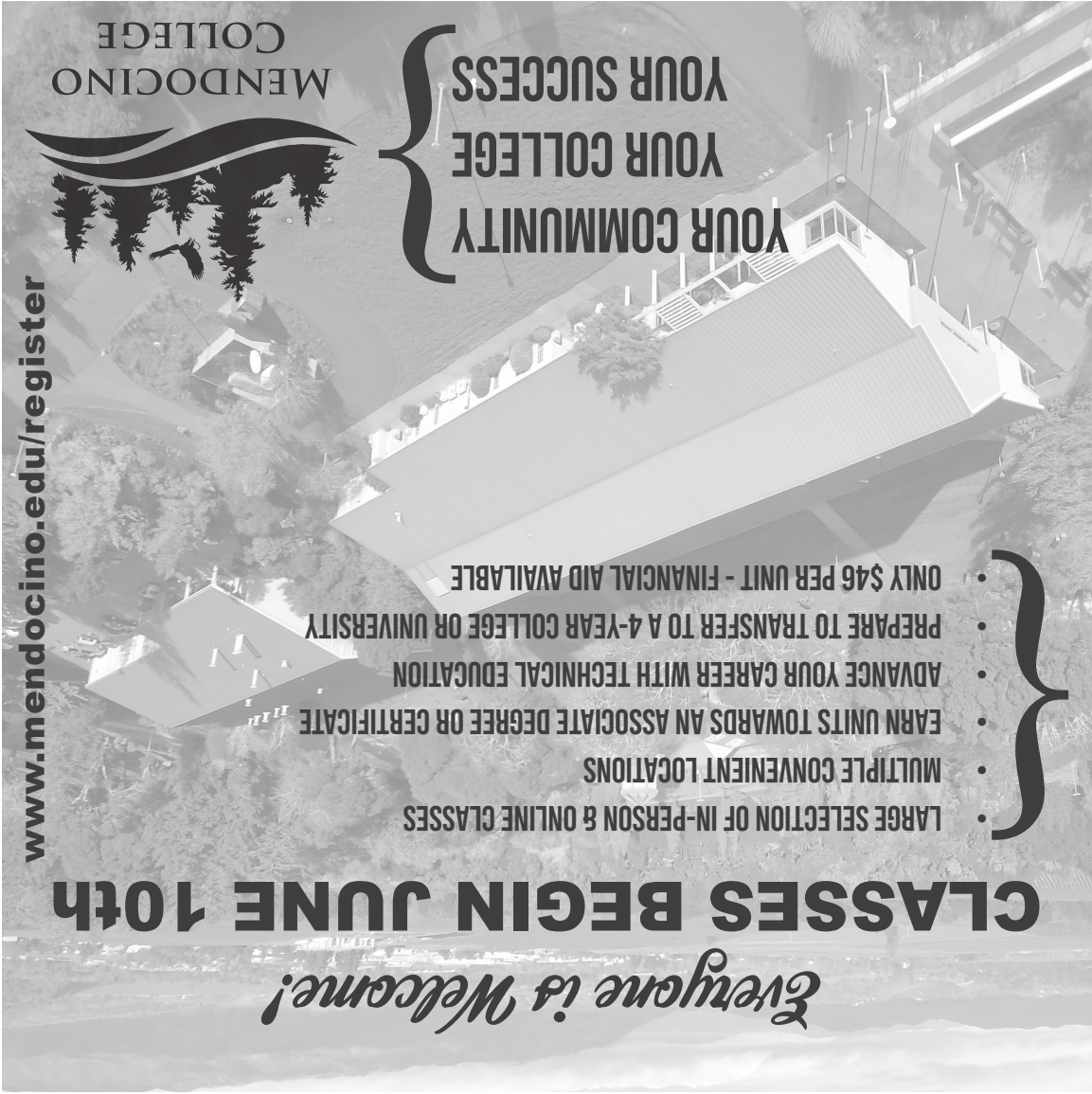
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
