

- Noemi Doohan, former director of Public Health, attended the last Nursing Advisory Committee in April, 2020 which included representatives from all district hospitals, Aurora Public Health, the Chancellor's Office North Far North Deputy Navigator, the Mendocino College Foundation, and other Mendocino College departments.
- Career Education Dean Dennis Aseltyne is meeting regularly with faculty and professionals in the Public Safety sector to respond to the Chancellor's Office Call to Action. We are exploring creating a Public Safety Advisory Committee to guide multiple disciplines/programs without full-time faculty
