GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Mendocino-Lake Community College District is seeking individuals with demonstrated instructional skills to join an outstanding team of faculty and instructional administrators to provide high quality services to our district, our community, and most importantly to our students. Appointment is contingent upon Board approval.

DEPARTMENT DESCRIPTION

The Automotive Technology Department provides full technical training in all areas of automotive repair. The department is certified by the Bureau of Automotive Repair to teach all smog certified areas. The department has one full time and three to four adjunct instructors who provide comprehensive and varied educational programs to meet the needs of all of our students.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

This position is full time for the Fall 2018 semester. The course load may include the following three classes: Introduction to Automotive Technology, Automotive Electrical Systems, and Manual Transmissions/Transaxles. The manual transmissions class is taught two evenings per week. The college encourages persons of all backgrounds and cultures, including persons with disabilities, to apply.

QUALIFICATIONS

Minimum qualifications are any bachelor's degree or higher and two years of professional experience in Automotive Technology, or any associate degree and six years of professional experience in Automotive Technology. Professional experience is required when the applicant possesses a master's degree.

If you do not possess the minimum qualifications, exactly as listed above, you must file for equivalency. If claiming equivalency, applicants are responsible for documenting all course work, degree programs and related professional experience at the time of application.
