Mendocino College Human Services Programs

Mental Health Workforce Education and Training (MHWET) Scholarship

Purpose

The MHWET scholarship is to support students who are willing to work within the public mental health services continuum of care¹ in Mendocino County, and is intended for individuals pursuing education in Human Services, Counseling, Social Work, Psychology, or related fields. Up to \$5,000 is available to eligible students.

Eligibility Requirements

Scholarships will be offered to selected students who meet the following requirements:

- 1. Mendocino County resident.
- 2. Willing to make a commitment to work within the public mental health system in Mendocino County for at least two (2) years.
- 3. Declared major in Human Services, Counseling, Social Work, or Psychology programs.

Scholarships will be offered to students based on the following priorities.

- 1. Students who are residents of, or providing services in an "outlying area" defined as a service area other than Ukiah, Fort Bragg, and Willits
- 2. Students who are English/Spanish, bi-lingual
- 3. Students who are bilingual
- 4. Mental health consumers or their family members
- 5. Students of Latino or Native American ethnicity
- 6. Transferring to a 4-year college/university or pursuing a higher degree in Human Services, Counseling, Social Work, Psychology, or related fields.
- 7. Current Mendocino College students or graduates

Application Procedure

- 2. In addition to the application, submit the following documents:
 - a. College transcripts
 - b. Two letters of recommendation (one academic; one professional)
 - c. Letter of acceptance to a 4-year public college or university degree program in Human Services, Counseling, Social Work, Psychology, or related fields.
 - d. A signed Letter of Commitment to work within the public mental health system in Mendocino County for at least two (2) years.
