



# University of California (UC) & California State University (CSU) IGETC Transfer Requirements 2021-2022

IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum) is the recommended general education (GE) pattern for students who are considering applying to **either** a UC or a CSU. However, students planning to major in engineering, biological or a physical science should focus on completing major prep courses and may not have time to complete all of IGETC before transfer. These students will need to complete the minimum general education (GE) requirements along with their major prep courses for admission, rather than completion of IGETC, please see a college counselor for more information. **(Courses that are multiple area listed are indicated by a £ and can only be used to meet the requirements of a single area.)**
